Regulatory requirements: applicable to LSW and LCSW: A Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) must hold a masters degree in their profession and have two years of post-masters supervision. A Licensed Social Worker (LSW) must hold a masters degree in social work. Applicable to Marriage and Family Therapists: after completing the master's degree program, at least 2000 clock hours of experience over a minimum of two years must be completed. Of the 2000 experience hours 1500 of the hours have to be face to face in direct contact with a client. In addition, 1000 of the hours have to be working with couples or families in diagnosing, assessing and intervention. The supervision requirements for this portion of the licensing are 100 hours over a period of no less than two years.

The practice of licensed social workers, licensed clinical social workers, and licensed marriage and family therapists is regulated by the Mental Health Licensing Section of the Division of Registrations of the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies. Under the Colorado Mental Health Practice Statute, **12.43.214 CRS**, you are entitled to receive information about the methods of clinical work, the techniques used, the duration of clinical work (if known), and the fee structure. You may seek a second opinion from another licensed or registered mental health professional or you may terminate our work at any time. In a professional relationship sexual intimacy is inappropriate and should be reported to the Board that licenses, registers, or certifies the licensee, registrant or certificate holder.

Generally, the information provided by and to a client during sessions is legally confidential and cannot be released without the client's consent. There are exceptions to this confidentiality, some of which are listed in section **CRS 12.43.218** and the **HIPAA Notice of Privacy Rights** you were provided, as well as other exceptions in Colorado and Federal law. For example, mental health professionals are required to report child abuse to authorities. Confidentiality is further discussed in my **Practice Policies and Procedures**.
